Inpatient Services

Next Step Inpatient Withdrawal Unit provides supervised, medical treatment for clients 18 years and older requiring withdrawal from alcohol and other drugs.

The 17 bed unit is staffed 24 hours a day, seven days a week by nurses and allied health workers. Doctors are on site during normal business hours and are available on call after hours including weekends and public holidays.

Generally withdrawal involves a 7 day admission and there is a no visiting policy for the duration of the clients' stay.

Group Program and Activities

The unit runs a therapeutic and education focused group program every day. Groups are an important component of treatment and everyone is expected to participate

Admissions

The Inpatient Withdrawal Unit receives elective or booked admissions, with pregnant women, Indigenous clients and people from rural and remote areas, considered as high priorities.

Clients requiring withdrawal treatment can be referred through Next Step's outpatient services at East Perth, Community Alcohol and Drug Services, other healthcare providers, counseling and legal services.

Further information and assistance can be provided through the Community Alcohol and Drug Services and the Alcohol and Drug Support Line.

Important Information

- Clients are encouraged to have a post withdrawal plan developed with their referrer prior to their admission.
- Once a referral is received, the client will be contacted by the Inpatient Withdrawal Unit Clinical Nurse Specialist to discuss referral and admission plan.
- To help ensure client safety and security the unit has a no visiting policy.
- There is no access to mobile phones and internet for the duration of the stay
- Smoking is not permitted. Nicotine replacement therapy will be provided where needed for the duration of the admission.
