

What do you have to do?

During your meeting, the Diversion Officer will

- Talk to you about your drug and alcohol use, and anything else you want to talk about
- Give you useful information about drugs and alcohol
- Help you sort out problems that might be caused by your drug or alcohol use.

The Diversion Officer can continue to see you, or refer you on to see someone else if there is anything more you want to talk about or need help with.

YPOP is a free program that can help you

Why do it?

YPOP gives you and your family the chance to talk to a Diversion (YPOP) Officer who is a drug and alcohol counsellor.

It can help you with:

- Avoiding problems caused by using drugs or alcohol
- Staying out of trouble with the police
- Talking with your family about the problems caused by using drugs or alcohol.

Juvenile Justice Team (JJT).

You are referred to a Juvenile Justice Team

As part of your Action Plan the JJT refers you to see the Diversion Officer.



Meeting your Diversion Officer

The Diversion Officer will meet with you and talk about drugs and alcohol and their effect on your life.



Counselling

If you choose to, you will continue to see the Diversion Officer or another drug and alcohol counsellor.

This can help you with any problems caused by your drug and alcohol use.



The drug and alcohol counsellor or Diversion Officer provides feedback to the JJT. If you choose to, you can continue to see a drug and alcohol counsellor.

Meeting with your Diversion Officer and your family

Your parents or carers can also see the Diversion Officer for information, counselling or referral to other services.



You and your parents can also see the Diversion Officer together if you choose.
