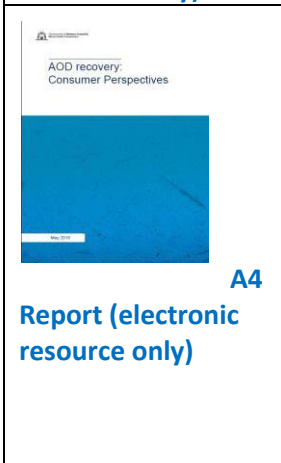


Consumer Perspectives: Alcohol and other drug and mental health services (2020)
